Service Highlights:

The region currently has an eighty year old childcare worker who is enrolled in her first computer class and has just completed a 3 credit hour hybrid early child development class, sponsored by Guilford Child Development and NC A&T State University, with an "A": "*I am so excited. Never dreamed I could do this. Thank you so much for your support and help.*"

A director whose teachers received Technical Assistance: "After participating in Quality Rating Improvement the content of the talk of these (teachers) is encouraging and positive rather than discouraging and negative when they speak with the children. They are also now skillful at interpreting children's attempts to communicate and can now follow through appropriately and timely. I find them now to be more flexible and able to meet the individualized needs of the children."

Parents comments after receiving referral services: "I hope Guilford County knows what a jewel they have in you! My child and I moved to Guilford County to escape domestic violence but I had to continue to drive 90 miles for my job until I could find work here. You were able to find child care that could serve my extended hours and also provided a scholarship for a portion of the child care."
