

To report child maltreatment in a family child care home, a person should contact

DCDEE Intake Unit at 919-814-6450

Provide as much detail as possible about the child who was maltreated and those involved in the specific incident, in addition to the name, address, phone number and county for the child care facility.

10A NCAC 09 .2201 ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS GENERAL PROVISIONS

(b) The Division shall consider the following factors when determining whether to issue an administrative action or what type of administrative action to be issued, including:
6.) a **self-report** of the violation or incident was submitted to the Division by the operator;

If a professional is concerned about child abuse/neglect in a child's home, a report should be made immediately to local DSS in the county where the family child care home is located and can be found **here**.





110-105.4. DUTY TO REPORT CHILD MALTREATMENT

(a) Any person who has cause to suspect that a child in a child care facility has been maltreated, as defined by G.S. 110-105.3, or has died as the result of maltreatment occurring in a child care facility, shall report the case of that child to the Department. The report may be made orally, by telephone, or in writing.

The North Carolina Child Care Resource & Referral Statewide Family Child Care (FCC) Project welcomes you to the 2023 edition of the FCC Resource Guide!


